





Make invitations

- > Can you come to ... on ...?
- ➤ Would you like to ...?
- > We'd love to invite you to ...
- > How about ...?
- ➤ We do hope you could join us.



Accept invitations

- Sure.
- Sure, I'd love to.
- Sure, Mary.
- Sure. Thanks for *asking* (invitation).
- Great. I'd love to.



Make declination

- Sorry, I can't.
- I'm sorry, I can't.
- I'd love to, but I have to ...
- I'm sorry, I have to ...
- I'm sorry, I'm going ...
- Maybe another (next)time.
- Thanks for asking.
